

### **Almond Pathways: Growing for Tomorrow**

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### **Abstract**

Skilled university graduates play a pivotal role in the progression and future of the Australian Almond Industry. If the industry continues along its current trajectory of rapid growth and expansion, there will become an even greater shortage of skilled graduates to progress into leadership, and management roles, limiting the industry's ability to innovate, adapt, and sustain continued growth. The Almond Pathways: Growing for Tomorrow Graduate Program will provide graduates with structured exposure across the industry, allowing them to progress into desired industry roles and begin their career in the Australian Almond Industry.

### The Issue: Low skilled graduate intake into industry

Lack of Structured Industry Programs

- No industry-led graduate program post-university
- Limited access or trial internships for current students

Limited Academic Exposure


- Minimal horticultural coverage at university level
- Stronger focus on other agricultural industries (university dependent)

Competition with Other Industries

- Competing for jobs and graduate programs
- Eg. Elders, Nutrien

Marketing and Promotion Challenges

- Lack of awareness on post-university job availability
- Minimal promotion of the Australian Almond Industry to potential graduates



### Addressing the lack of structured industry programs

The lack of structured industry programs has been identified as one of the key reasons for low skilled graduate intake levels into the industry. Although some major stakeholders in the industry have their own internship opportunities and graduate programs, there is no available industry-led graduate program which would provide comprehensive exposure to the Australian Almond Industry as a whole.

### How it works:

- A **precursor** to the Growing Almond Leaders Program developed by the Almond Board of Australia (ABA).
- 4 graduates per year.
- 4 main focus areas across industry.
- 11 weeks per focus area.
- Rotation through each focus area.
- Combined 2-week Almond Short Course (similar to UC Davis) at program conclusion as a cohort.
- Opportunity to attend ABA Field Days and Workshops.
- **Graduation** at bi-annual Australian Almond Conference.
- Mentoring access throughout program Graduates of the Growing Almond Leaders
  Program would be the ideal candidates to guide
  this cohort of young graduates through the early
  stages of their careers.



### **Further Considerations**

Further considerations will also need to be made including but not limited to:

- Industry Participants companies willing to participate and take graduates on board.
- **Promotion** key universities/educators with a strong agriculture/horticulture focus. Consider application process and opening and closing dates.
- **Housing availability** across the growing regions. Subsidised?
- Integration of graduates into local communities importance for mental health & wellbeing.
- Support and supervision of the cohort throughout the program regular check-ins and reviews at the end of each focus area.
- Almond Short Course Potential for overseas exposure or experts could travel to Australia?
- Program Responsibility & Funding ABA. Potential access to funding? WH&S responsibility.
